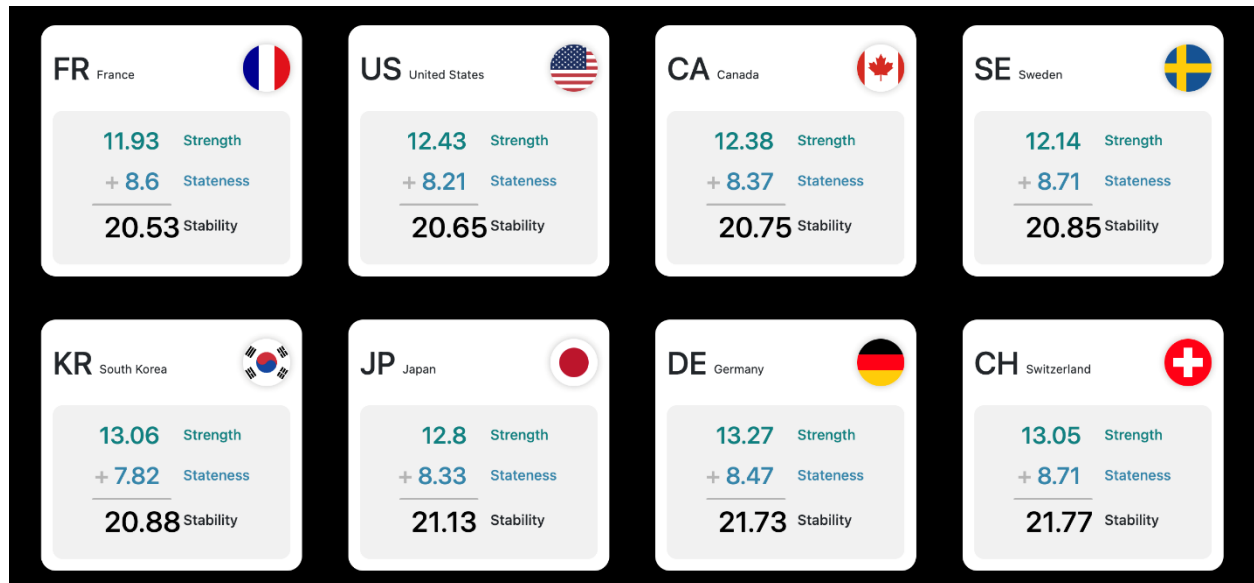


AlphaGeo releases the Periodic Table of States (PTOS) meta-index to rank the stability of nations

Country rankings are a dime a dozen, but how many of them actually reveal the ground truth of a place – or even tell you something new?

Welcome to the Periodic Table of States (PTOS), the first global index that isn't just about armies and populations, wealth and currencies, freedom and governance, energy and sustainability – but *all* of these factors at the same time. Call it a meta-index – an index of indexes – that comprehensively compares countries according to metrics that really matter.

Two decades ago, AlphaGeo founder & CEO Dr. Parag Khanna set out to organize and measure country characteristics as we do with elements in the Periodic Table. The results are genuinely novel. Rather than big countries (such as America and China) coming out on top because of their immense power, or small ones such as Denmark and New Zealand claiming top honors because of their non-corrupt democracy, PTOS gives equal weight to *Strength* and *Stateness*, resulting in an aggregate score for the ultimate virtue: *Stability*.

PTOS is the first holistic and neutral approach to ranking states in which big and small, East and West, democratic and technocratic states cohabitate in the top tier. Leading the pack are Switzerland and Germany, Japan and Korea, the US and Canada – but Singapore and China, Saudi Arabia and the UAE aren't far behind.

PTOS therefore captures not just legacy achievements but *momentum* in areas like technological innovation, food security, infrastructure quality and climate resilience – factors that indicate which states really have master plans for their future.

There is much more to explore in the Periodic Table of States (PTOS) including rigorous correlation tables, Venn diagrams capturing alliance formations (NATO and the BRICS), migration patterns, and even transnational groups such as stateless companies, tech platforms and political movements.

PTOS can be useful for:

- Governments to benchmark against key metrics and devise strategies to improve
- Investors and analysts to incorporate new criteria for asset allocation
- Scholars and students to update their approaches to evaluating national performance
